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Upper Skagit Library Sponsors Smart Horizons Career Online High School Students

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Concrete, WA: The Upper Skagit Library is proud to announce that it is sponsoring students seeking their high school diploma via the Career Online High School Program by Smart Horizons. Adults 19 and older who have not earned an accredited high school diploma or equivalent, who reside in the Upper Skagit Library service district, and have a library account in good standing or are willing to obtain one, are eligible for sponsorship. Applying for the program is simple and can be done via website either at home or at the library. Applicants must choose one of the offered career learning paths, enroll in a prerequisite course, and complete it within two weeks. After that, students will be contacted with information regarding the next steps, which, if accepted into the program, include being matched with a mentor and arranging access to technology needed to complete the course if needed. The program is available in English as well as several other languages. Once the course is completed students will have their high school diploma as well as a certificate in their career path chosen at the beginning of the program, courtesy of Cognia.

So far more than 11,000 students have earned their diploma with Career Online High School, and the Upper Skagit Library is excited to help add more students to that number. Having recently completed a Strategic Planning process where the library reevaluated its vision and mission statements, as well as its values and goals for the upcoming years, the library has identified "Education for All" as one of its core values. Staff members, the Board of Trustees, and those in the community who answered the survey conducted by the library identified increased access to education as a top local need, and the library has doubled-down on its efforts to increase access to materials, programs, and other educational opportunities. Partnering with the Career Online High School to bring education to adults who might not otherwise have access is just the most recent step taken in these efforts to support a community many have identified as underserved in this area. In the Strategic Goals document approved by the Upper Skagit Library Board of Trustees in late 2022, the Strategic Planning Committee wrote that the library and its partners "believe that education is important in every stage of life and should always be available to those who need or want it. Education can take many forms and we commit to providing a variety of resources and educational opportunities to learners of all ages and to provide spaces for our community to explore and be creative. We will [support education access] by hosting programs and inviting guest instructors to teach courses free of charge to the community, making educational items available at no cost, demonstrating and encouraging creativity in art and in problem solving, and providing the space and opportunity for accessing information."
